Score of 0, 0.5, 1, 1.5 or 2 for each if the indicator is met

41 indicators chosen in total, distributed into 5 pillars with different weights :

- Governance and policy commitments: 10%;
- Embedding respect and human rights due diligence: 25%;
- Remedies and grievance mechanisms: 20%;
- Performance: Company human rights practices: 25%;
- Performance: Response to serious allegations: 20%.
